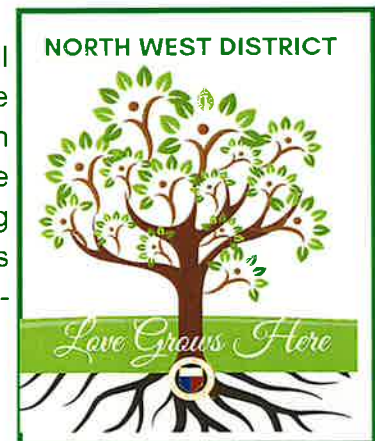

## HOW TO HOLD MEMBERS

We are beginning a new club year in our GFWC Georgia clubs. It's time to take an inventory of your membership.



- Does your club have a purpose? Are you fulfilling that purpose? Do you meet “just to be meeting” or is your club accomplishing something?
- Are your club meetings too long? Members can be “turned off” by long, dull meetings. A well-organized agenda and adherence to it will eliminate this problem. Reports by committees and community service program should be short and concise. Begin on time, keep within time limitations on reports, and you will see improvement in the total meeting.
- Do your programs vary enough to keep members interested? Do limit program time to 20 to 30 minutes, so the audience doesn't get restless?
- Analyze carefully the number of projects and try to space them out so that every month you are not raising money.
- The Board is the backbone of the club... We can't function without that but we must be careful not to have the same people always on it without ever involving new faces. If we want to keep our members, we must keep them involved.
- Reach out to younger people in your community. They are the future of our clubs.

### Something to Ponder

#### How Safe Are Your Personal Care Products?

Find 3 to 4 shampoo, soaps, cleaning products, or other personal care product bottles. Does each bottle have an ingredient list? Look up the product and/or chemical ingredients on [Environmental Working Group's Skin Deep Database](#). You can search by product name or by looking up the specific chemicals listed on the ingredient list. Assess the rank of the chemicals or products you use.

#### Discussion Questions:

- Did all of your products have an ingredient list? Discuss concerns related to lack of labeling and transparency?
- What assumptions are you able to make and not make about your product if data is limited?
- What challenges might different people face with limiting or eliminating toxic chemicals in household products?
- Who should be responsible for making sure products are safe?



## Domestic Violence- Dale Reddick

According to the Love is Respect website, dating violence is more common than people think, especially among teens and young adults: ***one in three teens*** in the US will experience physical, sexual, or emotional abuse from someone they're in a relationship with before they become adults, and nearly half (43%) of college women report experiencing violent or abusive dating behaviors. It can also include stalking and harassment.

Every February, young people and their loved ones join together across the country for a national effort to raise awareness about the issue of teen dating violence through **Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month (TDVAM)**. This annual, month-long push focuses on advocacy and education to stop dating violence before it starts.

**Love is Respect** is excited to announce the theme for TDVAM 2022 is **Talk About It**. Talk About It is a call to action to young people and those who support them to engage in meaningful conversations about healthy relationships and navigate what may be unhealthy or even abusive. For further information go to the Love is Respect website where you will find the TDVAM Action Guide.

According to the **Center for Disease Control**, teen DV has both serious short-term and long-term consequences. While healthy relationships tend to have a positive effect on emotional development and future relationships, abusive relationships often do the opposite. Dating violence victims are likely to experience suicidal thoughts, antisocial behaviors, depression and anxiety, and engage in unhealthy behaviors such as alcohol and drug use. Unfortunately, many cases go unreported because victims are afraid to tell their family and friends.

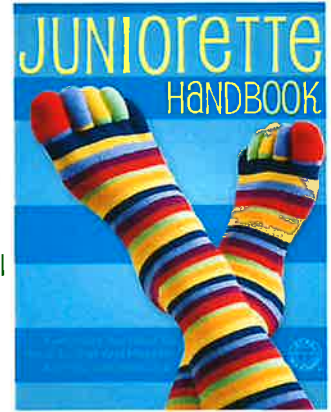
- How did you work together to build your tower?

Did you know in 1969 GFWC created a special category called Juniorette. This was part of [its "Build with Youth for a Better World" program](#).

Over the years, GFWC Georgia has had several Juniorette clubs, but during the COVID pandemic, all clubs disbanded.

The time is now to help rebuild our Juniorette clubs. Forming a club is easier than you might think.

1. There must be a general or junior club to sponsor a Juniorette club;
2. There must be an advisor; and
3. A minimum of three members are needed to start a club.

Even though there are other requirements such as establishing meeting times, location, dues, what is outlined above is important in starting a club.

In the past, Juniorette club members were from the same school, but this is not a requirement.

When looking for members to start a club consider current members club members' daughters, granddaughters' even other family members. There might be young ladies in your neighborhood who you would like to introduce to GFWC. Juniorette is the perfect opportunity to introduce her to GFWC.

Many students are taught at home. Often these young ladies are looking for activities in which they can participate.

Remember a Juniorette today is a Junior or General club member tomorrow.

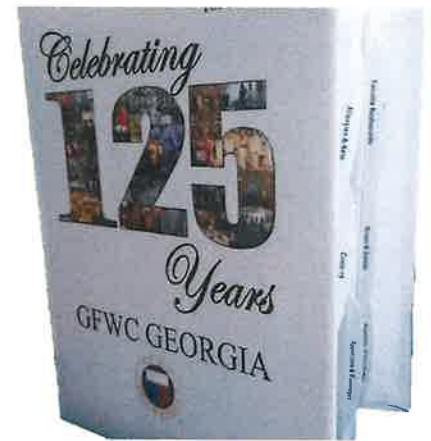
