

Ladies have been busy birds and welcoming new birds to their clubhouses.

We have inducted new members who found us through their REALTOR sharing the *Welcome to the Community* postcards. These past two years, we have distributed 10,000 postcards.

Thank you to everyone who submitted reports and did such great work in Membership this past year.

- We had 32 (an increase over last year) clubs submit a Membership report, representing 182 projects, 4759 hours, \$20,951.10 club dollars, and \$20,607.81 in-kind dollars.
- We had 26 clubs hold a GFWC National Day of Service event for Food Insecurity, representing 857.50 hours, \$7,752 club dollars, and \$9,429 in-kind dollars.
- We had 11 clubs hold a GFWC Georgia Day of Service dinner party, representing 790.5 hours, \$9,525.76 club dollars, and \$4,952.51 in-kind dollars.
- We had 101 new members join the Georgia Federation in 2023. We have a total membership of 1,509. 1371 are Woman's clubs, 112 are Juniors, and 26 are Juniorettes.
- We have 63 clubs. 52 Woman's Clubs, 9 Junior Clubs, and 2 Juniorette clubs.

Districts had an increase in membership.

- Central East netted 6 members
- North East 6 members.
- South East 9 members
- South West 23 members
- North West 71 members.

We chartered one new club, the GFWC G.E.M.S., a Juniorette club in Sylvania this year. We will be formally introducing them at the 2024 convention. Thank you to Dale and Kathryn and the leadership of your club, GFWC Sylvania Junior Woman's Club, for creating this new club.

Special congratulations to the GFWC Dallas Woman's Club, which started 2023 with 7 members and finished the year with 48 members. This incredible increase resulted from creating a website, hosting an Open House and a team of ladies working very hard to make it happen! Special thanks to Cimi Douglass and Jennifer Spivey for your amazing leadership.

Clubs provided Dollars for Delegates.

Clubs held Membership social events—picnics, dinner, lunch, breakfast, and even a Jack O Lantern painting event.

Members:

- wore name tags,
- held fashion shows and cooking classes,

- wore club t-shirts,
- gave out member awards,
- presented pins for membership,
- held floral workshops and delivered arrangements to members,
- recognized perfect attendance,
- walked in community parades,
- sent cards to members to celebrate births, deaths and with get well messages,
- held installation of new members,
- created member handbooks and held new member orientation.
- posted on social media,
- built a club website,
- advertised in the local newspaper,
- formed night groups, and
- even built a club scarecrow for the town square.

Clubs are planning their 2024 Day of Service/Dinner Party to benefit Wellspring Living. Clubs statewide will hold the membership event on Saturday, April 20.

I thank everyone for your support of membership, and it has been an honor to serve as the Third Vice President these past two years.

One of the benefits of being a Juniorette is that you qualify to become a member of Epsilon Sigma Omicron (ESO). ESO "is an honorary educational society open to all per-capita dues paying GFWC federated clubs." Georgia has an ESO chapter.

In a nutshell, it is a society that encourages its members to read books. You document a book by submitting the title to the chairman as you complete it. While reading is the objective of ESO, it is not structured in that you must read a specific number of books during a certain period. However, a minimum number of books must be read to grow within ESO.

As a Juniorette, you probably have a reading list you get at the beginning of each school year and perhaps a summer reading list. You might enjoy reading and create your reading list. Whatever the reason, you're on your way to being a member.

So, what must you do to become a member? Contact the Georgia chapter ESO chairman and ask for a pledge application. Once you reach a certain number of books, you will receive a certificate confirming your ESO membership. Following that, there are five additional categories, which will be acknowledged after reading a certain number of books - you will have a lifetime to reach the highest level.

After submitting the title of books you have read to GFWC Georgia's ESO chairman, consider registering on <u>Goodreads</u> or a similar app. This app allows you to set up virtual shelves of books you have read, want to read, or are currently reading. The book titles are always there for your reference.

First and foremost, I want to thank everyone for their timely payment of dues and for the generous donations allocated to

Second, I want to remind everyone that tax season is upon us and there are two dates for some clubs to remember.

- 1) If your club is a registered non-profit corporation (i.e., have Articles of Incorporation filed with the Georgia Secretary of State), your annual registration fee (\$30) is due by **April 1**.
- 2) If your club is a 501(c)(3), **May 15** is the due date for filing Form 990-series returns for calendar-year tax-exempt organizations.

Learn how to maintain your organization's tax-exempt status.

Leaders of charitable organizations should be familiar with their responsibilities and the various actions that can jeopardize their organization's tax-exempt status. The <u>Maintaining 501(c)(3) Tax-exempt Status Course</u> discusses what charitable volunteers and employees must do to maintain this valuable exemption and which actions can result in revocation of exempt status. The <u>Small to Mid-size 501(c)(3) Organization</u>

<u>Workshop</u> provides additional information on tax-exempt organizations' benefits, limitations, and expectations.




Thank you to every club that submitted a Leadership report. We had:

What if I can't view them on the day they are posted? No problem! As they are prerecorded, they are available in the Media section of the Forum page and can be watched and rewatched at your convenience.


